

Punta Cana: With its stunning white sand beaches and crystal clear waters, allinclusive resorts and elegant boutique hotels, it is one of the most popular wedding destinations in the Dominican Republic. Luxury resorts offer complete wedding packages and a wide range of services for the bride and groom and their guests.

Puerto Plata: This northern region of the Dominican Republic offers a combination of pristine beaches, lush mountains and charming colonial and Victorian architecture.

Resorts in Puerto Plata offer a variety of wedding options, from intimate beach ceremonies to elegant receptions in ballrooms overlooking the sea. Puerto Plata also boasts the highest cable car in the Caribbean, making it a must-see.

Angelo, passionate about art and special creations, has found his vocation as a chef specializing in wedding pastries. His experience of more than 14 years makes him an expert in the field. Wedding cakes are crucial elements in any wedding celebration, and today, there are a wide variety of options to choose from:

Minimalist: Minimalist cakes with simple layers, clean lines and subtle decorations are gaining popularity. These elegant designs are perfectly suited for modern weddings.

Hand-painted details: Cakes with hand-painted details are increasingly in demand and add a unique artistic touch to cakes.

Fondant effect: Fondant is in fashion. This style offers an elegant and modern look. Fondant allows exceptional creativity in cake decoration.





Interesting textures: such as imitation lace, watercolor effects or geometric patterns are trending in contemporary weddings. These textures add visual depth to the cake.

Themed Personalization: Personalized cakes that reflect the couple's interests or hobbies are gaining ground. From favorite movies to travel locations, these cakes highlight the personality and dreams of the bride and groom.

Naked cakes: Naked cakes are ideal for rustic weddings. These cakes, often decorated with natural elements such as fruits or flowers, offer a relaxed and authentic style.

Chantilly cream vs. Buttercream: In humid climates like Panama, Chantilly cream can melt quickly, which affects the appearance and texture of the cake. Therefore, buttercream is a better choice. It is similar in



taste and texture, but more resistant to heat and humidity, for a climate like ours. Meringue is also a popular alternative for frosting cakes, especially if you are looking for a lighter, airier texture.

The size of the cake is very important and does not necessarily relate to the size of the cake. The important thing is to find a balance between the number of guests and aesthetics. Often, large cakes are used as impressive centerpieces at the reception. However, not all cake tiers need to be edible; some can be faux (cardboard) to achieve the desired height without wasting food. Decoration also influences the perception of size. A suitable base or table enhances the presence of the cake.

Tastings and preferences are essential for choosing flavors. Offering 3 to 4 options allows the bride and groom to make clearer decisions. At the same time, considering the guests' preferences is key.

While the cake should reflect the tastes of the bride and groom, it should also be appreciated by the majority of the guests.


Another aspect that is liked is Personalized Toppers. However, some couples prefer to omit the toppers to maintain a minimalist style.

Plan ahead. We know that finding and selecting the cake well in advance allows us to coordinate all the details and make adjustments if necessary. Working in coordination with decorators and wedding planners ensures a flawless presentation.

This is why we recommend that the choice of the wedding cake should be made in advance, choosing the personal taste with the creativity of the pastry chef.

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The wedding dance, that magical moment that illuminates the dance floor at the wedding celebration, is that moment that transcends a tradition to become the "happening" where the couple embodies their essence and love. This moment symbolizes the beginning of a new chapter in the lives of the couples who join in marriage, through the dance celebrates the union, commitment and the promise of a shared future.

The roots of the bride and groom dance go back to ancient customs that honored the union of two families and communities. There is no single starting point, several historical influences can be identified that contribute to its development:

- 1. Community feasts and celebrations: in ancient cultures, weddings were community events that included dances and rituals to celebrate the union of the couple and strengthen social ties. These dances were usually group and festive, involving the entire community in "el bailongo", as we say in Mexico.
- **2. Court dances:** In the Middle Ages and the Renaissance, European courts developed





elaborate dances as a form of entertainment and artistic expression. These dances were characterized by their elegance and formality, in the purest "Game of Thrones" style.

- 3. The Viennese waltz: At the end of the 18th century, the Viennese waltz became popular in Europe and became the ballroom dance par excellence. Its romantic rhythm and twirling movement (if you've seen "Bridgerton" you know what I'm talking about) made it ideal for expressing love and togetherness, and it was soon incorporated into wedding celebrations.
- 4. The tradition of opening the dance: In the 19th century, it became customary for the bride and groom to open the dance at weddings, symbolizing their first act as a married couple and marking the beginning of the great celebration.



Those who know me know that dancing is one of my greatest passions, so when couples make an effort and want to surprise through dance, I have to accept it, I am the most excited.

Below, I share some keys to make this moment unforgettable:

- **1.** Choose the right song: Music is the soul of the dance, so choosing a song that makes sense to you and excites you is key to create that WOW! moment.
- **2. Explore your creativity:** Don't be afraid to go out of the box and design an original choreography that reflects your personality and style.
- **3.** Rehearse and have fun: Practice makes perfect, but don't stress too much if there is a mistake, it's your day, and no one else knows the choreography, the important thing is not perfection, but to have a special moment and enjoy it.

4. Use elements that elevate the experience: Using sparklers, confetti, costumes and props will help you take the performance to another level. Use these elements to your advantage to create a memorable moment.

The wedding dance is much more than a tradition, it is a ritual of love, a celebration as a couple and an artistic expression that will remain engraved in the hearts of the couple and their loved ones. With a touch of originality, emotion and a dose of love, this moment will become a memory that will last forever.



To speak of Jewish Weddings is to speak with knowledge and understanding of the history that surrounds an evolving civilization full of rituals, customs and traditions that will allow us to create unique celebrations.

The magic of Jewish destination weddings lies in the life history of our couples; in the "background" that each family will share and will allow us to "materialize" in events that will create unforgettable memories.

Let's go by parts, first we must understand the difference between a ritual, a custom and a tradition:

A **RITUAL** is the action or series of actions that are repeated, often in a religious or social environment. Rituals are practices that have accompanied people throughout their existence and remain in the present time (with modifications or adaptations) as is the case in political, social, sports, funeral/mourning and recreational practices.





On the other hand, a **CUSTOM**, is or are the actions and activities that are habitually carried out with the family, for example, celebrating a birthday, celebrating a commemorative date, going out to eat with a relative on Sundays, going for a walk or eating grapes on New Year's Day, etc.

A **TRADITION** is a belief or behavior that is passed from generation to generation in a family, culture, or religion.

That is why Jewish weddings are a mixture of rituals, customs and traditions that each family has adopted from generation to generation and that by carrying them out in a destination, will allow them to impregnate a life experience with an adventurous touch.

It is not our duty to know what each couple wants, but it is our duty to ask, that is where the importance of understanding the



significance and the essence that it entails is born. In this way, the information we receive will allow us to "mold" the experience that our clients/our couple wishes to transmit to their family and friends.

It is worth mentioning that in many occasions it will be the parents who will be more involved in the planning and design of this experience. Although it may seem strange to you, for the couple it is normal for their parents to be involved and in many occasions they are the ones who make the decisions. 




5. Richard Burton (1964)

8. Larry Fortensky (1991)



What if we plan a destination wedding?



Hello Dear Tribe of Brides! How are you? If this idea or question has crossed your mind it's not as crazy as it seems! It can be a great idea to celebrate your love through an experience that will last more than just a few hours like a local wedding!

Having a destination wedding involves staying overnight in a different location than where you as a couple and your guests live or reside. How far you want to go for your destination wedding, well that's up to you, as it can be within the same country as well as a destination a few hours' drive away or something so international that it involves flying! What they definitely have in common is that by involving a trip, the experience is extended, as it at least involves a weekend where it even lends itself to have other events included:

ICE BREAKER, which is a relaxed event where all the guests can get to know each other and is the perfect welcome so that, as the name says, the ice breaks among them and they can start to get to know each other, which will ensure that by the time of the wedding reception they will already have anecdotes or stories in common that were born the night before.

THE WEDDING, of course this is the main day of the celebration, where your ceremony and reception will take place, with all the protocols and special moments that a





wedding per se includes and carries, with the great reward of having your guests set and enjoying from at least one day before, living together and having the experience of having traveled.

TORNABODA, is a post-wedding celebration to get together again and close the weekend celebration on a high note, in which a brunch and recovery drinks are usually served. Of course, the central topic of conversation is everything that happened at the wedding the day before!

You can also include some sightseeing or cultural tours of the destination you are traveling to in order to enhance your wedding!

The most important thing is that this celebration is extended as a "mini-vacation" as it allows your guests to take on a different mood with the excitement of traveling, packing their bags and probably getting to know a different place.



Now, these are my recommendations for you to have a GREAT DESTINATION WEDDING:

- 1. Hire a Destination Wedding Planner, since the logistics involved in planning a wedding of this type goes beyond just planning the wedding, because many times you have to consider options such as lodging, transportation, tours or itineraries and have connections or suppliers in other destinations. Relax! This does not imply more work for you as a couple.
- 2. Choose a destination that has good connectivity with your place of residence, either by flight, land or even sea, a place that is easily accessible for both you and your guests.
- 3. Check the weather according to the season of the year in which you want to get married, that way you will make sure that it is pleasant and does not jeopardize the plans of the type of wedding you want to have.
- 4. Budget: NO, A DESTINATION WEDDING IS NOT MORE EXPENSIVE. Believe it or not, it will not cost you more than a local

wedding, since most of what changes are the inclusions or characteristics of the type of elements for the wedding.

5. The guest list automatically shrinks, since not everyone can always join you on a trip! But it is a great way to rule out guests without you being the one to leave someone out, of course. Consider if there is someone on your guest list that you would like to accompany you on your big day and it is not possible for them to take a plane. Check the possibility of them arriving by some other means and being able to accompany you or if this would be a reason not to have a wedding of this type.

6. Local vendors: in addition to becoming sustainable, by hiring local vendors you can obtain two main benefits: avoid paying travel expenses for bringing vendors from other locations (or as few as possible) and supporting the local economy of the destination you are visiting.

I hope these recommendations will help you solve your doubts about whether or not a Destination Wedding is for you.



Safety should never be sacrified for the sake of aesthetics, celebration or economy. It is a vital reminder that, in the wedding and event industry, every detail counts, especially when it comes to protecting the lives and well-being of everyone involved.

I am Norma Gómez and on September 29th, 2022 I saw my second skin being born. After a totally successful year in which there was no time to rest, that Friday we were in an event which was going normally, according to the logistics and what had been planned for months to have a successful event. My eagerness for maximum control led me to go to the kitchen (here the first mistake), I wanted to collaborate and this led me to manipulate the burner of a samovar, and due to a bad practice of one of the kitchen assistants there was an explosion with industrial alcohol. I took the worst part; burns of grade 2 and 3 in 35% of my body, from there 18 reconstructive surgeries, almost 70 days in a clinic away from my Pereira, my family and my home, feeling the hardest pains that a human being can live, taking into account that the skin is the largest organ of the body and that a burn is the worst aggression that can be suffered.





Thanks to God, the love of my family, my friends, my industry partners, my strength and incredible resilience I have been overcoming this bad moment in my life and which has led me today through my experience to carry the message of safety at events.

Preventing tragedies in the world of weddings and events: a lesson in survival.

Amidst the beauty and joy of a social event, life can change in an instant. This was the case for me. This tragic incident not only transformed my life, but also propelled me on a mission: to alert the wedding and event industry to the importance of safety.

I share my story as a warning and a call to action. From electrical safety to fire safety measures, advocating for strict standards and safe practices that could save lives.

My testimony not only inspires reflection, but also highlights the urgent need for education and preparation in event planning. Through my courageous fight and commitment, I dream that no other celebratory event will be marred by preventable tragedies.

Let's talk about prevention:

Preventing tragedies in the world of weddings and events requires a comprehensive and proactive approach to safety. Here are some key points:

- **1. Facility inspection and maintenance:** Prior to the event, it is crucial to verify that all electrical installations, kitchen equipment, and emergency systems are in good condition and comply with safety regulations.
- **2. Emergency planning:** Having a detailed plan for emergency situations, including evacuation of guests and handling of possible fires or accidents, is essential. All organizers and staff should be trained and familiar with this plan.




- **3. Food safety:** Ensuring that food and beverages are prepared, handled and served in a safe manner to avoid food poisoning or other health problems.








Why saying "Yes, I do" in Medellín, the city of eternal spring, is to see magic come true.

Welcome to the land of enchantment, where the magical realism that our books have told us so much about is inspired in every architectural and cultural piece to flourish. When a couple decides to find their location, they are choosing more than just a physical space; they are looking for the setting for their love and that changes everything. Like Ryan and Vivi, who in the midst of their life in Manhattan with a vibrant New York in the background, imagine getting married amidst flowers, lots of greenery but at the same time with very imposing architecture, not only honoring their place of residence but their love, which unites his tranquility and freshness with her beauty and elegance.

The photo of the Orquideorama, a treasure located inside the botanical garden in the heart of Medellín, makes you feel an immediate gravitation towards its great wooden proposal that, like a magnet, attracts all eyes. Several major cities in Latin America have botanical gardens that offer lively spaces for weddings. Thanks to being a wedding planner I have been to very intimate celebrations, such as Ryan and Viviana's ceremony which, although it was accompanied by over two hundred hearts, the fibers of the soul were touched in such a sacred way by Kate, their officiant, and the union of two cultures in love made it even closer. We must not condemn intimacy to the 'elopement' or to a specific number; we must not take anything for granted, for if there is one thing I have learned in this work it is that the surprises and lessons are endless, and that as anything can happen, opening ourselves to explore from each partner is the best narrative we can bring.





To be majestic, imposing and abundant is nothing more than a bet of self-confidence and love for each other. Tables in spirals of more than eight meters, big, tall, colorful floral arrangements; falls, candles and more mixes was a challenge overcome thanks to the commitment of a great decoration team; just like the dance floor filled all night long by the great work of the DJ, or the shows that surprised even more all our illustrious visitors from abroad. It would not have been possible without our greatest source of inspiration: the love of two wonderful people who dreamed big, celebrated long hours and were the best hosts to share the wedding of the year with their people, or as I say it, "pipol".

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In the dictionary of the Royal Spanish Academy (RAE), the word "CONVENTIONAL" is defined as something "that brings together the characteristics of what is habitual, traditional or mostly accepted; that is subject to a formula or custom and lacks spontaneity, originality or expressiveness".

In the universe of wedding ceremonies, we could say that both religious and civil ceremonies fall within this qualification of conventional ceremonies. On the one hand, religious ceremonies are subject traditions and formulas that are repeated over and over again, so we could say that if they lack anything it is originality and spontaneity. On the other hand, civil ceremonies or ceremonies with legal content are also governed by the laws of respective countries the and. with honorable exceptions, we could conclude that they are not characterised by their expressiveness either, but rather that they are all rather formal.

In this context, a few decades ago, a new type of wedding ceremony appeared that tries to break with the aforementioned conventions, to talk about what traditional ceremonies usually do not talk about, and what couples most demand when they start to imagine the most dreamed day of their lives: a ceremony that talks about them and, fundamentally, about their love story.





The first unconventional ceremonies appeared among divorced couples who could not remarry, either legally (in those countries that did not recognize divorce) or because religion did not allow it (as in the case of the Catholic tradition).

This huge universe of couples, who were prevented from having their wedding ceremony, had to resort to symbolic ceremonies to complement the civil union and to have a ceremony more in line with their taste or preferences.

At the same time, many couples began to perceive the inconvenience of having the ceremony on the same day of the event but in a different location, forcing all the wedding attendees to move from one place to another (with the consequent discomfort of getting in and out of vehicles with dresses, heels and all the fittings) and so this custom that seemed to be strongly rooted began to be questioned.

Thus, in some Latin American countries, unconventional ceremonies began to proliferate, giving rise to new companies and professionals who exploit this niche within the wedding market.

Types of ceremonies

We could classify these ceremonies fundamentally by their content and, in this sense, secular ceremonies, ceremonies with religious content and ceremonies with legal content stand out.

Secular ceremonies, as they have no religious or legal content, are the most personalized of all and have become the "vedette" in recent years. Thousands of couples began to choose this type of ceremony, which combines warmth, a relaxed style and the exact tone that each couple wants to give to their celebration. They are based on the theme of love, the couple and their history, that is to say, they delve into the reasons that led these two people to fall in love, choose each other and choose to celebrate their love with their guests.

The boom in this type of ceremonies really exploded in some countries, such as Argentina, where new companies, vendors and professionals dedicated exclusively to these celebrations have proliferated. Today we can find masters of ceremonies, officiants, musicians and singers, air fresheners and vendors of all kinds that offer their products and services to complement these ceremonies and make them have the unique touch that each couple wants to give them.

The ceremonies of delivery of booklet are the alternative for those couples who want to have on the day of the event a ceremony with legal content, similar to those of the Civil Registry. That is to say, they speak of the institution of marriage, based on the legal regulations of each country, but they have no legal value because they are not officiated by public officials but by independent professionals (lawyers, masters of ceremony, etc.).

Their distinctive feature is that, despite being a "civil" type of ceremony, their development also includes an area of personalization about the couple's history, so they are no longer merely formal and impersonal.

Finally, although many couples are still unaware of it, there are ceremonies that religious content but. unconventional. In the case of Catholic ceremonies, when priests are not allowed to consecrate marriages outside the church and, in other cases, the bride and groom are not allowed to take the sacrament of marriage, there are the Ring Blessings, which are ceremonies similar to the traditional ones but symbolic, i.e. without a sacrament. Not in all countries (or cities) it is easy to find priests or deacons to officiate at these ceremonies, but it is often possible to replace them with other types of officiants, such as pastors, deacons or retired priests.



The other religious traditions (Protestant Christians, Jews and Muslims) do allow for valid wedding ceremonies in non-religious spaces (such as event halls). In these cases, departing from 'conventionality' may mean choosing a special or unique location for the couple, different from those usually used, such as a beach.

Another type of ceremony with religious content that, although they have been performed for more than two decades, have grown impressively in recent years, are the Shared Ceremonies, wrongly called "mixed". These are ceremonies in which two religious officiants take part, representing the faith of each of the contracting parties (for example, a priest with a rabbi, an imām with a pastor, These beautiful ceremonies etc.). performed virtually everywhere in the free world (read: where there is no persecution for religious reasons) and capture the curiosity and praise of those who attend them. They are symbolic ceremonies, replete with blessings and rituals that are shared by both partners in a framework of absolute parity and respect.





Finally, there is also a type of ceremonies, less known than the rest, which are the "true" Mixed Ceremonies. These ceremonies are chosen by interfaith couples who opt for a ceremony with religious content but do not want the intervention of a religious officiant (priest, rabbi, etc.), so they are officiated by masters of ceremony without identification with any particular religion. In them, characteristic rituals texts and are incorporated, but no blessings are pronounced.

In conclusion, the next time we have the opportunity to advise a couple who are thinking about their wedding ceremony, I would ask them: "Why have the same old ceremony when you can have the ceremony of your dreams?"

A look at objective, real and high impact sustainable practices.

Ecuador is on its way to becoming the most important destination wedding venue in South America. Quito, its capital city, has a market of vendors offering different specialised services, such as food and beverage experiences made with local products, decoration with premium or export quality roses, dream locations and much more. All this from the hand of great professionals in event organisation. However, for the market to grow in a sustainable way, it is important to analyse the environmental, social and economic impact of these activities.

To learn a little more about examples of good practices that enable the above, we interviewed Juan Carlos Rodríguez, CEO of the Ecuadorian cocktail brand Shake And Drink, which is innovating in its two business lines (Mobile Bars and Cocktail Mixes) and implements a solid Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) strategy.

Juan Carlos tells us that after six years of effort and dedication, the brand has managed to carry out actions that allow them to grow, working in harmony with nature, promoting responsible consumption and thus improving the cocktail culture in Ecuador.





Juan Carlos, how can we minimise environmental impact and generate economic growth?

Shake And Drink has managed to put CSR at the centre of its actions. To do this, we have not invested large economic resources, but we have put a lot of commitment, convinced that these actions have a final impact on our reputation and therefore on the achievement of our objectives. On the environmental side we seek to reduce our carbon footprint, to achieve this we have established sustainable practices in the production processes of the cocktail mixes and in the execution of the events. To take care of water, for example, we have designed a sofisticated portable equipment for washing glasses with steam; and for recycling we have opted for returnable containers. We have set up an alliance with a circular economy approach, delivering clean, classified, single-use and reusable material to the Renarec Association, made up of mostly elderly women who make a living from this activity. We also promote fair trade with the wholesale purchase of fruit, herbs, juices and inputs from small producers and traders in the area where our factory is located.

You sell a cocktail service, so how do you promote responsible consumption?

From day one of our service as Shake And Drink Mobile Bars we have emphasised that the open bar is not synonymous with excess or lack of control, quite the opposite, we promote drinking rich rather than a lot, for this we use high quality inputs that end up in macerations, in funds, in syrups and honeys, perfect companions of good cocktails.

the service we control Through consumption of the guests at a party and offer innovative non-alcoholic options. We do not sell the cocktail bar itself, that is implicit, we sell quality service, elegance and sophistication. We don't post pictures on social media of liquor brands or people but rather living a cocktail drinking, experience, mostly personalised. In addition, we have an initiative that provides a payment break for designated drivers (on average 1 per 10 guests). This initiative, however, needs to be embraced and managed by the event organisers and the customers themselves.

In these six years, how have you managed to build customer loyalty through these initiatives?

We communicate to our customers what is behind our service and our product usually during previous meetings and face-to-face negotiations; this has turned out to be a





great added value and allows us to humanise our brand. At the same time, we work very closely with our staff, they are our internal customers, thus avoiding absence and labour turnover, something that is often seen in this market. Our team is made up of at least 60% women, we promote their economic empowerment and the prevention of gender-based violence in their lives.

How do you think this type of initiative can be replicated in Ecuador or elsewhere in Latin America?

Sometimes we think that these practices are only applicable to huge companies. However, this events market is built by all of us, and everyone has a fundamental role to play in positioning ourselves in a coherent and responsible way. It is important to map where we can improve our practices and implement small actions that can have a big impact, not only for the business, but also on others. Finally, we believe that the events market has the opportunity to contribute a lot to the development of our country, today more than ever we must work and learn as a network.



It is a piece that many will treasure and inherit as well, so much of her energy and essence has to be there.

In Idilia we specialize in headdresses, tiaras, crowns and earrings, designed thinking in the different styles that every bride has and wants to reflect in her wedding.





Discovering your style

Every bride who comes to Idilia has a unique vision for her wedding. Some look for a classic and sophisticated style, opting for tiaras that add a touch of elegance to their look. Others prefer a more bohemian style, where floral headpieces become a "must" to accompany the look.

Every Idilia bride I have attended has left me with the satisfaction of knowing that, when she gets to the altar, that extra light reflected in her accessories will make her shine even brighter.






