

So, if you are getting married and have eaten out of a pot, take your precautions.

Would you rather live without internet or without wedding planning?

Without internet! Weddings have been done in all times, they are part of humanity and will always be. Today we have the internet, artificial intelligence has arrived, surely in a few years we will have another advance, but weddings will always be there, and I will continue to plan experiences that tell stories, even without the internet.

What is the worst seat on an airplane?

Next to the bathroom, without a doubt. Say no more!

What is the most annoying thing people can do at a wedding?

Bringing another guest in addition to those indicated on their invitation card without



consulting with the bride and groom. Even asking is disrespectful, but not asking is even more disrespectful.

Should there be children at a wedding?

To children: sweet dreams. A child at an adult celebration is out of his or her environment, even exposed to adult situations and behaviors. This generates risks in their restless innocence that are difficult to control. A child does not have a good time, even if you hire entertainment and care for them; neither the parents nor the child will really enjoy the evening.

Who is your dream guest at a wedding?

The one who enjoys, laughs and celebrates heartily with his host, the one you see happy with happiness (worth the redundancy). To this kind of guest you can give a piece of stale bread with water or a glass of Champagne and lobster that they will enjoy with the same affection, because they are there to celebrate with their host, they value being part of that experience and then they will tell a nice story.

What would you do tomorrow if you won a million euros today?

I would have a coffee, have breakfast and then check if the million euros is still there.

What would you fill your favorite sandwich with?

Burrata or Gouda cheese, ham and sausage, rougula and dijon mustard.

Are you more into wine or drinks?

Undoubtedly, wine... wine is an excellent conductor of conversations and emotions, chats around a delicious dish or tapas that combine grape varieties and seasonings. Any time is a good time to enjoy a glass of wine and contemplate life.

How do you feel about banning cell phones at a wedding?

Where do I sign to make it law? No doubt technology has made our lives easier, but when you are coordinating the entrance of a bride through the center aisle of the church and 12 cell phones get in the way of the photographer's shot including one that streams live on IG and another on WhatsApp,





I really wish I could take away the cell phones of the guests, waiters and anyone with a phone that would ruin something so unique. Cell phones and social networks are the great pandemic of this century, I say this with all responsibility, even though I work and live with one of them in my hand.

Is it dangerous to hang photos of clients in the office?

Undoubtedly it is, not only dangerous but invasive to their privacy. It is very difficult to photograph our work as planners without having hosts, guests or elements of a vendor of the evening in that photo. In the case of clients it is more delicate to do so, even when we have their consent.

What would your company be called if you had to open a new ofice in Jupiter?

I would call it Shoemaker Levy-9, as a comet that fragmented and then impacted Jupiter in the 1990s was baptized. It certainly left its mark on that planet, becoming part of it forever.

Is garlic and onion served at your weddings?

Garlic and onion are extraordinary ingredients, companions and allies of gastronomy. I do not exclude them, I just avoid making them such protagonists that they overshadow the evening with extreme flavors and sensations.

If your role in Titanic had been Rose, would you have given Jack room on the board?

I really think that in my case I would have been given the role of Jack. How sad that Rose is so selfish with that board, I'm sure we could both fit.

Have you ever considered changing to a religion other than the one you profess?

Religion is within us, it reflects through the windows of our eyes, through the corridor of our words and the actions of our hands. True religion resides in your essence what you do with it and the world. However, I share and enjoy diverse friendships that profess and follow the Creator in different religions and they all have their common ground. Fanaticism in any of them is one I would never profess.





What would you be willing to do for your company to receive Michelin stars?

I would love to have a catering company so special that Michelin would turn to enjoy it and award it with a Michelin star, but I think their awards only go to chefs and restaurants.

Remote or face-to-face work?

Nowadays the dynamics leads you to work in both modalities; technology, distances and the client we serve today require both. A video call is effective, but humans are beings of contact, energy, connection; that happens with warmth, face to face.

What do you like most about your country and what do you like least?

What I like the most: Its natural beauty! What I like the least: The incredulity of our inhabitants.



The certification ensures that all vendors and services involved in these weddings meet the standards required by the Jewish community, guaranteeing an authentic and high quality experience. The importance of this certification cannot be underestimated. Not only does it put Colombia on the map as a premier Jewish wedding destination, but it also ensures that the celebrations are conducted with respect and adherence to traditions and customs, which is crucial to attracting more international couples.

In fact, one of the great achievements of this certification was that in August 2024 Bridal Agency organized the first Jewish wedding in the city of Santa Marta, which originated after the first edition of the "MAZEL-TOV" program in the previous year. Rachel and Norman were the couple who gave us their trust for us to organize the most important day of their lives, where we witnessed how they sealed their union, besides allowing us to live an enriching experience full of many learnings.





This makes clear the success of the certification and the growing interest in Colombia as a Jewish wedding destination and highlights the immense potential that this sector has to continue developing in our country. Moreover, it not only brings economic prosperity, but also promotes cultural diversity and strengthens the ties between Colombia and the international Jewish community. On the other hand, we are pleased to inform that, in 2025, the Eje Cafetero will host the third edition of the "MAZEL- TOV" certification, which promises to continue raising the standards and expanding the opportunities for this type of celebrations.

The Palpa weddings, characteristic of the central Andean region of Peru, are celebrations full of joy and commitment that stand out for their traditional structure and their focus on "EL AYNI", a Quechua word that translates into reciprocity.

In Huancayo - Peru, these weddings have been maintained as a significant practice within the community, preserving the essence of the marriage bond within a framework of tradition and responsibility.

The Typical Proposal from the Church: A Living Tradition

Once the religious ceremony has concluded, the Palpa wedding begins with the reception of the bride and groom at the exit of the church to the rhythm of a typical orchestra whose music invites the community to accompany the couple in their celebration.





The Role of the Godparents:

A year before the wedding, the families of the bride and groom visit the future godparents with offerings such as live and benefited animals, raw and cooked, varieties of fruits, crates of beer and breads in different varieties. This act is called "Entrance to the Godparents", a moment in which the godparents commit themselves to finance certain traditional aspects such as the typical orchestra, the wedding rings, the bride's dress and everything related to the religious celebration.

Their participation is so important that it is considered an honor and a commitment that reflects the couple's trust and respect for them. Thus, in gratitude, before the delivery of gifts, the families of the bride and groom this time accompanied by the community in a vigorous and joyful dance enter with offerings similar to those of the entrance, on this occasion called "compliance to the godparents", this being an integral part of the tradition, fulfilling the attentions as a sign of respect and consideration towards them.



The Presentation of Gifts

The godparents lead the parade followed by the parents and relatives of the bride and groom. To the rhythm of traditional music they hand out expensive gifts ranging from cash, real estate, vehicles, trips, dozens of crates of beer and appliances that will serve the new couple in the formation of their new home.

Attention to Cultural Details:

It is important to respect and highlight the cultural details that make a palpa wedding unique. This can include from the agreement of the competition between the bride and groom's family for the delivery of gifts, to the days of the celebration; the central day of the wedding, the second day of "Opening Gifts" in which the winner of the competition is determined and the third day in charge of the godparents.

Election of trusted secretaries:

Two or more registrars or secretaries should be selected, who will take note of each gift given to the bride and groom and make a balance at the end of La Palpa. Thus, on the second day they will proceed to open the gifts in the order they were given and will continue with the tradition of reciprocity, that is, the gifts given will be returned in due time at the same value.





As organizers, it is crucial to maintain clear and fluid communication with parents and godparents from the beginning of the process. Their role is vital, so it is essential to define their responsibilities. Maintaining a close relationship with them can ensure smooth planning.

Palpa Weddings in Huancayo - Peru are events full of meaning, where tradition and commitment are fundamental aspects. With proper planning and a deep respect for local customs, these weddings become unforgettable experiences that celebrate not only the union of two people, but also the community ties that sustain them. For a wedding planner, understanding managing these aspects with care is essential to creating a celebration that honors both the bride and groom and their cultural heritage.



An interview with Gaby Aguilar.



I feel that by doing bridal makeup, I can not only unleash my full potential in my art but also create a connection with the brides to understand them and ensure they look exactly as they've always imagined on one of the most special days of their lives.

2. What are the most popular makeup trends you've seen emerging in weddings this year?

Many brides still opt for very natural and timeless looks, but something that's very trendy right now is foxy eyes to make the gaze sexier, a very natural but long-lasting glowy skin, lips that look big and juicy, and plenty of blush.





3. How have bridal makeup trends evolved in recent years, and what do you predict will be big in the coming year?

I believe every bride tries to keep her wedding makeup in a very personal style, but something we definitely see now are warmer tones on the eyes and skin, much more shine than before; previously, they opted for cooler tones with matte skin and lips.

4. Are there any specific makeup looks or techniques that brides are requesting more frequently now?

Most brides want radiant skin and glossy lips, regardless of the fact that the longevity may be shorter than if using matte products with longer-lasting formulas.

5. What are the current trends in terms of bridal lip colors and finishes?

Lip liners that are a bit darker than the lipstick shade are definitely in vogue right now, and lipsticks with light pink undertones and gloss are very popular.

6. How do you incorporate the latest makeup trends while ensuring a timeless look for wedding photos?

I think staying with neutral tones helps the makeup look more natural. In the end, it's about enhancing each individual's features and respecting their wishes and personality, ensuring they still look like themselves. This way, in photos years later, they won't regret the makeup choice they made for their wedding day and will want to show those photos over the years, regardless of fashion trends.

7. Are there any trends in makeup that you think brides should avoid for their wedding day?

I definitely wouldn't recommend a black smoky eye, overly thick eyeliner, very large lashes, or overly light lips.




8. How do you customize your approach to makeup for brides with different skin tones, textures, and preferences?

Color theory and knowing what types of products suit each skin type are very important here, but what I love is combining different shades and textures so that the skin looks perfect both in person and in photos.

9. What is your advice for brides who want to stay on-trend but also want to look like themselves on their wedding day?

Bridal trials will definitely help a lot to ensure the bride is confident about what she wants on the big day, but I think starting with a more minimal approach and opting for subtle details that make a difference while still complementing her natural beauty is always best.





10. What inspired you to specialize in bridal makeup, and how has your personal style influenced the way you approach makeup for weddings?

I think being part of one of the most important days in someone's life is beautiful, and seeing my clients, sometimes nervous, stressed, or tired before starting the makeup process, and then seeing their reaction and how their mood changes once they're made up and ready to get married is one of the greatest rewards of my job. I'm a person with a very natural style when it comes to clothing and makeup, and I like to think that I share that with my brides. Through a good conversation and good vibes, I try to make the makeup experience not just a service but a true experience.

As we conclude this insightful discussion, it's clear that bridal makeup is not just about following trends but about creating a look that resonates with each bride's unique personality and vision for her wedding day. 



Live Music Orchestra



Tips: The weather in southern Chile can be unpredictable, so it is advisable to have a plan B for outdoor ceremonies.

Best time: Consider the months of October through March to take advantage of the milder weather and longer days.

Logistics: Make sure to hire a Wedding Planner if you choose a remote location. This way you will have support during the entire organization, both for you and your guests. They will help you with all the logistics, as some areas may require special transfers or more travel time. But that's not all. When Ruddy Pérez plays, with his mix of romantic merengue and ballads, couples come up, grab their partner and let themselves go. And that's when you see the incredible: from the youngest to the oldest, everyone is in tune, laughing, singing and, of course, dancing like there's no tomorrow.



But wait, there's still the good part: the perico ripiao.

Suddenly, you feel the change of rhythm, and in comes that more traditional sound, the authentic *perico ripiao* with its accordion, tambora and güira. It is a direct trip to the Dominican roots. Now, the dance floor is filled with joy with that country sound that reminds you of the country days; the village parties. Everyone's feet move almost effortlessly, as if the rhythm is in the DNA. 

Dembow is the sound that bridges the gap between old rhythms and modern urban energy. Chimbala and Rochy RD are not far behind. Songs like "Maniquí" and "Ella no es tuya" are the perfect fuel to keep everyone dancing like there's no tomorrow. This is the time when the heels have flown, the ties are off, and the smiles don't stop. This is what you call real crazy hour!

But, not everything is crazy.

But, of course, it's not all a frenzy. After the gale of merengue, perico ripiao and dembow, comes the more sentimental part. The DJ lowers the revs and bachata comes in. Romeo Santos with "Propuesta Indecente" and Aventura with "Obsesión" are the perfect soundtrack for the bride and groom to look into each other's eyes, hold hands and share their first dance.



The guests, meanwhile, let themselves be carried away by the romanticism of bachata. The movements are smooth, the hugs tighter, and in the air you can feel that touch of love that makes every wedding unique.

Of course there is salsa!

No Dominican wedding would be complete without a good salsa set to spice it up. Marc Anthony with "Vivir Mi Vida" and Gilberto Santa Rosa with "Que Manera de Quererte" get everyone on their feet again. Salsa is the perfect balance between the craziness of dembow and the romance of bachata. The dance floor is filled with quick steps, spins and complicit smiles.

Grand finale

As the music begins to slow down and the lights flicker announcing the end, everyone is exhausted but happy. Goodbyes are filled with sweaty hugs, laughter and promises that it was "the best wedding ever." And in the Dominican Republic, a wedding is not just a ceremony: it is a musical journey through the best of culture, traditions and trends. We dare say that it is well known worldwide that the family is very important in all cultures.

The tradition in weddings begins with the religious or civil ceremony, and although there are brides and grooms who prefer a civil wedding, there are many couples who look forward to a conservative religious wedding.

Today, unlike in the past, couples get married out of love, passion, because they hit it off, and because they feel like it! And although with the pandemic, mass weddings have been forgotten, family and close friends can not miss.

We usually celebrate weddings whose reception lasts several hours.

The groom is usually accompanied on the bridal procession down the aisle by his mother. She remains by his side until the





bride arrives and they both stand with the priest or ceremoniant at the altar. The most special moment is the arrival of the bride, who for her part goes on the arm of her father and in case of his absence, she can choose a relative to whom she feels very close or has strong ties of affection, which shows the importance of family. But, before living the most awaited moment, which is the arrival of the bride, her procession enters, formed by her godparents, bridesmaids, maid of honor, followed by the children's procession or pageboys.

The rings and *arras* (wedding tokens or coins) are exchanged during the wedding and at the end of the ceremony, it is common to throw rice, rose petals and in some cases, if the bride and groom are very cheerful, confetti.

During the celebration some bride and groom decide to sit separately and others decide to be accompanied by their parents.

Another tradition is the first dance of the bride and groom and a second dance with the parents of both on a dance floor, which is usually placed in the center of the party room, and which is set according to the theme chosen by the bride and groom for the party.



Another tradition is the souvenir. It consists of the bride and groom giving a keepsake related to their wedding.

The food is very important; regularly a menu is chosen according to the roots of the bride and groom and that is liked by the guests.

Attire for the Bride and Groom.

In these times the options of wedding dresses are innumerable, but the white color is still the favorite and the most used. It is still kindly forbidden for guests to wear this color.

Within the tradition there is also the veil, but personally I must say that the mantilla veils, although little used today, look beautiful on brides.

The groom's suit, much will depend on his tastes and other factors; if the wedding is indoors or outdoors, if it is a black tie





wedding or if it is a themed wedding. Traditionally the groom wears a dark suit and it is common for the best man to match the groom's suit.

The Bouquet!

One of the traditions that has survived the passage of time is, without a doubt, the bouquet of flowers that few brides renounce.

The reality is that nowadays the bouquet has a more aesthetic than spiritual meaning, but as every detail or symbol of a wedding, its origin comes from a time when it was practically essential to carry it. However, as with everything, the theories about the origin of this tradition are different in each place.



1. Reply to the Invitation on Time

The "RSVP" (Reply Please) is very important. The bride and groom need to know how many people will be attending in order to organize the event properly. Don't leave the confirmation to the last minute or show up unannounced.

2. Follow the dress code.

If the invitation specifies a dress code, be sure to follow it. From formal weddings to more relaxed celebrations, proper attire demonstrates respect for the event and its organizers.

3. Be punctual

The ceremony is the most important moment for the bride and groom, so it is essential to arrive on time and attend. Being late can be disrespectful and cause distractions, even more so during the ceremony. Not attending the ceremony and arriving directly to the cocktail party is rude.





4. Don't Interrupt the Ceremony with Photos or Videos

Although it may be tempting to take photos or videos during the ceremony, it is best to leave this task to professional photographers. By being present and enjoying the moment rather than watching it on a screen, you contribute to a solemn and respectful atmosphere.

5. Avoid Inviting Others

If the invitation is addressed only to you, do not bring extra guests without first consulting with the bride and groom. The wedding has a limited number of guests, and you should not exceed it.





6. Avoid Wearing White (unless otherwise indicated).


At most weddings, white is a color reserved for the bride. Wearing this color, unless the bride and groom have requested it, can be seen as disrespectful.

7. Drink moderately

While many weddings include an open bar, it is important to remember that alcohol consumption should be in moderation. Avoid awkward situations or losing control by drinking too much.

8. Respect the Protocol during the Ceremony and reception.

Follow the instructions of the organizers and respect the assigned place at the ceremony and reception. Do not change seats without asking and do not interrupt the established order.



9. Be Respectful of Photographers and Staff

Let the photographers do their job. Don't get in the way of capturing important photos, and respect the event staff, who are there to make sure everything goes smoothly.

10. Participate in the Celebration, but watch your behavior.

It is important to enjoy the celebration and participate in the party, but without overdoing it. Maintain a respectful behavior with the bride and groom and other guests.

Final Thoughts

Attending a wedding is an act of affection and appreciation for the bride and groom, and complying with the rules of etiquette is not only a sign of respect, but also a way to contribute to making the event a beautiful memory for everyone. Every little gesture counts to make the day flow with harmony and joy. By being a guest who follows the rules of courtesy, you will be showing your appreciation for having been part of such a significative moment. Remember that the best gift is your presence, accompanied by respect and good manners!

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


